

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1. SAFETY WARNINGS



WARNING: Risk of fire / flammable materials

- This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments; farm houses and by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments; bed and breakfast type environments; catering and similar non-retail applications.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
- Do not store explosive substances such as aerosol cans with a flammable propellant in this appliance.
- The appliance has to be unplugged after use and before carrying out user maintenance on the appliance.
- WARNING: Keep ventilation openings, in the appliance enclosure or in the built-in structure, clear of obstruction.

- WARNING: When positioning the appliance, ensure the supply cord is not trapped or damaged.
- WARNING: Do not locate multiple portable socket-outlets or portable power supplies at the rear of the appliance.
- WARNING: Risk of child entrapment. Before you throw away your old refrigerator or freezer:
 - o Take off the doors.
 - o Leave the shelves in place so that children may not easily climb inside.
- WARNING: To avoid a hazard due to instability of the appliance, it must be fixed in accordance with the instructions.
- Do not use extension cords or ungrounded(two prong)adapters.
- The refrigerator must be disconnected from the source of electrical supply before attempting the installation of accessory.
- Refrigerant and cyclopentane foaming material used for the appliance are flammable. Therefore, when the appliance is scrapped, it shall be kept away from any fire source and be recovered by a special recovering company with corresponding qualification other than be disposed by combustion, so as to prevent damage to the environment or any other harm.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- WARNING: Connect to potable water supply only. (Suitable for ice making machine)
- Minimum/Maximum inlet water pressure,138/827 kPa (20/120 PSIG). (Suitable for ice making machine)

2. INSTALLATION

2.1 Location

When selecting a position for your unit you should make sure the floor is flat and firm, and the room is well ventilated. Avoid locating your unit near a heat source, e.g. cooker, boiler or radiator. Also avoid direct sunlight as it may increase the electrical consumption. Extreme cold ambient temperatures may also cause the unit not to perform properly. This unit is not designed for use in a garage or outdoor installation. Do not drape the unit with any covering.


When installing the unit, ensure that 3 inch of free space is left at both sides, 1 inch at the rear and 1 inch at the top of the unit. This will allow cold air to circulate around the refrigerator and improve the efficiency of the cooling process.

2.2 Reversing The Door Swing

NOTES:


When reversing the door swing: Read the instructions all the way through before starting. Handle parts carefully to avoid scratching paint. Set screws down by their related parts to avoid using them in the wrong places. Provide a non-scratching work surface for the doors. IMPORTANT: Once you begin, do not move the cabinet until door-swing reversal is completed. These instructions are for changing the hinges from the hinges back to the right side, follow these same instructions and reverse all references to left and right.


Unplug the refrigerator from its electrical outlet.

Phillips screwdriver Masking tape




1/5" socket and ratchet Putty knife and thin-blade screwdriver





REMOVE FREEZER DOOR

1. Remove all food from the inner door liner.




- 2. Tape the door shut with masking tape.
- 3. Remove one screw and hinge cover on top of the freezer door with a Phillips screwdriver.
- 4. Remove the 3 screws with a 1/5 socket and ratchet, then lift the hinge straight up to free the hinge pin from the socket in the top of the door.
- 5. Remove the tape and tilt the door away from the cabinet. Lift it off the center hinge pin.
- 6. Remove the hole cover with a thin-blade screwdriver on the other side of top hinge.

NOTE: Do not misplace the washer located on the top side of the center hinge pin. Set the door on a non-scratching surface with the inside up.

REMOVE REFRIGERATOR DOOR

- 1. Remove all food from the inner door liner.
- 2. Tape the door shut with masking tape.
- 3. Remove the center hinge by removing 3 hinge screws with a 1/5 socket and ratchet. Lift the hinge pin up and out of the door.




- 4. Remove the tape and tilt the door away from the cabinet. Lift the door straight up to free its bottom socket from the pin in the bottom hinge bracket.
- 5. Set the door on a non-scratching surface with the inside up.

CAUTION: Do not let door drop to the floor. To do so could damage the door stop.

REMOVE BOTTOM HINGE

1. Using a 1/5 socket and ratchet, remove the 4 screws from the bottom hinge. Taking care not to misplace the washer on the bottom hinge, move the bottom hinge from the right to the left side.


NOTE: If the washer is not on the hinge bracket, check to see if it is stuck to the bottom of the door.



2. Change axis of the bottom hinge to another side with a thin-blade screwdriver.

TRANSFER DOOR STOPS

On each door, move the metal door stop from the right to the left. Move any screws from the left to the right with a Phillips screwdriver.




REHANG THE REFRIGERATOR DOOR

1. Lower the refrigerator door onto the bottom hinge pin.


- 2. Screw the 4 screws into the center hinge location on the left side with a 1/5 socket and ratchet.
- 3. Straighten the door and place the center hinge pin into the opening on top of the door. Remember to include the washer.
- 4. Move the door into place, so you can align the center hinge bracket over the center hinge holes on the left side. Insert and tighten the two screws with a 1/5 socket and ratchet.

NOTE: Ensure the washer is in place on top of the hinge pin.



REHANG THE FREEZER DOOR


- 1. Lower the freezer door onto the center hinge pin. Be sure the washer is in place.
- 2. Lift the top hinge so the pin fits into the door socket. Support the door on the handle side and make sure the door is straight and the gap between the doors is even across the front. While holding the door in place, tighten the top hinge screws.



2.3 Door Handle Install Illumination

Note: Figures in the user manual are only for reference. The actual product may differ slightly. The refrigerator must be disconnected from the source of electrical supply before attempting the

installation of accessory.




(Pictures and objects are not consistent, in order to prevail in kind)

- ① Take out the two crisscross-screw; and install them into the door holes; turn the screws till to the bottom;
- ② Aim at screws to install the handle;
- ③ The screws in the hole at the side of the handle and turn the screws till them very tight;
- ④ Screw cap should be put on the screw.


2.4 Door Space Requirements

The unit's door must be able to open fully as shown. $W \times D \geqslant 50.8 \text{ inch} \times 58.5 \text{ inch}$



2.5 Levelling the Unit

To do this adjust the two levelling feet at the front of the unit. If the unit is not level, the door and magnetic seal alignments will not be covered properly.



Look down from the top, clockwise and counterclockwise loosening, tightening.

2.6 Cleaning Before Use

Wipe the inside of the unit with a weak solution of bicarbonate soda. Then rinse with warm water using a 'Wrung-out' sponge or cloth. Wash the shelves and salad bin in warm soapy water and dry completely before replacing in the unit. Clean the exterior of the unit with a damp cloth. If you require more information refer to the Cleaning section.

2.7 Before Using Your Unit

The refrigerator adopts 115V/60Hz, voltage fluctuations over the range of 98 $^{\sim}$ 132V will cause malfunction or even damage.

Do not damage the power cord under any condition so as to ensure safety use, do not use when the power cord is damaged or the plug is worn.

Do not put flammable, explosive, volatile and highly corrosive items in the refrigerator to prevent damages to the product or fire accidents.

Do not place flammable items near the refrigerator to avoid fires.

This product is household refrigerators and shall be only suitable for the storage of foods. According to national standards, household refrigerators shall not be used for other purposes, such as storage of blood, drugs or biological products.

Do not place items such as bottled or sealed container of fluid such as bottled beers and beverages in the freezer to prevent bursts and other losses.

Before placing any food in your unit, turn it on and wait for 24 hours, to make sure it is working properly and to allow it time to fall to the correct temperature. Your unit should not be overfilled.



♦ Before Plugging in

You must check that you have a socket which is compatible with the plug supplied with the unit.

Before Turning On!

Do not turn on until two hours after moving the unit.

2.8 Interior Accessories

Various glass or plastic storage shelves are included with your appliance - different models have different combinations.


You should always slide one of the full size glass storage shelves into the lowest set of guides, above the fruit and vegetable containers, and keep it in this position. To do this, pull the storage shelf forward until it can be swivelled upwards or downwards and removed.

Please do the same in reverse to insert the shelf at a different height.



In order to make the full use of the volume of the fresh food storage compartment and frozen-food storage compartment, the user can remove one or more shelves, drawers, out of the appliance, according to your daily use.



4. OPERATION

HMI and keys operation

The keys in HMI and display layout are referred in the following figure:



4.1 Key

A. SET position set key

4.2 Display screen

- 1 Shift 1
- 2 Shift 2
- ③ Shift 3
- (4) Shift 4
- (5) Shift 5
- (6) Standby indicator

4.3 Display

- Once initially powered on, the display screen (including the key light) is on full display for 3s, and then operates as the displayed middle shift.
- Normal operation display

In case of a failure, the appropriate LED light show in combination the failure code (in recycling display);

In case of no failures, the actual operation position of refrigerator will be on display.

4.4 Shift setting

Each time the shift setting key A is pressed once, the shift position changes one time. After the shift setting has been completed, the refrigerator will operate according to the set value after 5s. From left to right, the temperature is lower.

The shift regulation is:



4.5 The standby control function

When the fridge work, push the gear SET long SET 3 s (effective keys to loosen), refrigerator into standby function mode, standby indicator lights lit, all loads stop work;

When freezer in standby, short press gear SET button SET, refrigerator into the normal working state, standby indicator lights put out, return to normal working condition.

5. CLEANING

5.1 Defrosting

Auto-defrost for Frost-free Refrigerator

5.2 Cleaning the Interior and the Exterior of the Unit

- ◆ Remove all the shelves and the salad bin. To remove the salad bin first remove the lower door shelf.
- Wipe the inside of the unit with a weak solution of bicarbonate soda and then rinse with warm water using a "wrung-out" sponge or cloth. Wipe completely dry before replacing the shelves and salad bin.

 Use a damp cloth to clean the exterior, and then wipe with a standard furniture polish. Make sure that the door is closed to avoid the polish getting on the magnetic door seal or inside the unit.

5.3 Cleaning Tips

Condensation may appear on the outside of the unit. This may be due to a change in room temperature. Wipe of any moisture residue. If the problem continues, please contact a qualified technician for assistance.

6. MAINTENANCE

6.1 Changing the Internal Light

Lamp replacement by professionals.

6.2 Care When Handling / Moving Your Unit

Hold the unit around its sides or base when moving it. Under no circumstances should it be lifted by holding the edges of the top surface.

The refrigerator is arranged at the bottom of the condenser, be careful to keep the bottom dry rub, used in the process of handling process.

Confirm whether there before leveling feet before moving.

6.3 Servicing

The unit should be serviced by an authorized engineer and only genuine spare parts should be used. Under no circumstances should you attempt to repair the unit yourself. Repairs carried out by inexperienced persons may cause injury or serious malfunction. Contact a qualitatively technician.

6.4 Switching Off for Long Periods of Time

When the unit is not in use for a long period of time, disconnect it from the mains supply, empty all food and clean the appliance, leaving the door ajar to prevent from unpleasant smells.

7. Trouble shooting

7.1 Warm tips

- ◆The refrigerator enclosure may emit heat during operation specially in summer, this is caused by the radiation of the condenser, and it is a normal phenomenon.
- ◆ Condensation: condensation phenomenon will be detected on the exterior surface and door seals of the freezer when the ambient humidity is large, this is a normal phenomenon, and the condensation can be wiped away with a dry towel.
- ◆Buzz: Buzz will be generated by running compressor specially when starting up or shutting down.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

ARBITRATION CLAUSE. IMPORTANT. PLEASE REVIEW THIS ARBITRATION CLAUSE. IT AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS.

- (a) *Parties*: This arbitration clause (this "Arbitration Clause") affects your rights against Midea and any of its affiliates or employees or agents, successors, or assigns, all of whom together are referred to below as "we" or "us" for ease of reference.
- (b) ARBITRATION REQUIREMENT: EXCEPT AS STATED BELOW, ANY DISPUTE BETWEEN YOU AND ANY OF US SHALL BE DECIDED BY NEUTRAL, BINDING ARBITRATION RATHER THAN IN COURT OR BY JURY TRIAL. "Dispute" will be given the broadest possible meaning allowable by law. It includes any dispute, claim, or controversy arising from or relating to your purchase of this Product, any warranty upon the Product, or the Product's condition. It also includes determination of the scope or applicability of this Arbitration Clause. The arbitration requirement applies to claims in contract and tort, pursuant to statute, or otherwise.
- (c) CLASS-ARBITRATION WAIVER: ARBITRATION IS HANDLED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS. If you are required to advance any fees or costs to JAMS or other agreed upon arbitration administrator, but you ask Midea to do so in your stead, Midea will consider and respond to your request.
- (j) Survival and Enforceability of this Arbitration Clause: This Arbitration Clause shall survive the expiration or termination, or any transfer, of the warranty on your Product. If any part of this Arbitration Clause, except waivers of class-action rights, is found to be unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of this clause and the warranty shall remain enforceable. If, in a case in which class-action allegations have been made, the waiver of class-action rights under this warranty is found to be unenforceable with respect to any part of the dispute, the parts of the dispute as to which the waiver of class-action rights have been found unenforceable will be severed and will proceed in court without reference or application of this Arbitration Clause. Any remaining parts will proceed in arbitration.

QUEBEC RESIDENTS

The arbitration provisions of this warranty shall not apply to residents of Quebec.
